

BCL CU leader hacked by rivals

A LEADER of the Chittagong University unit of the Bangladesh Chhatra League, ruling Awami League-backed student organisation, was hacked by a rival faction on the university campus on Saturday night.

The victim was identified as Tayeful Hoque Topu, vice-president of CU BCL unit and a master's student of the university's economics department.

CU BCL senior vice-president Mansur Alam alleged that a group of CU BCL activists, led by BCL unit vice-president Mohammad Mamun and library secretary Abu Bakkar Toha, stabbed Topu while he was sitting at Jhupri in front of Shaheed Abdur Rab Hall at about 9:20pm, leaving him critically injured.

CU assistant proctor Liton Mitra said that Topu was undergoing treatment at Chittagong Medical College and Hospital and the situation on the campus was under control.

Hathazari police officer-in-charge Belal Uddin Mohammad Jahangir said that CU BCL hospitality affairs secretary Mizanur Rahman Mizan filed a case against 13 people, including 11 leaders and activists of the organisation, in this connection on Sunday.

The accused were—Abu Bakkar Toha, 22, Diaz Irfan Chowdhury, 28, Mohammad Mamun, 26, Soumen Palit, 26, Nazim Uddin, 26, Sumon Kanti Chowdhury, 23, Abu Sayed Marjan, 23, Abu Kaijar Roni, 26, Abu Hena Masum Kamal, 22, Mohammad Sumon, 22, Mohammad Masum, 30, Mohammad Mohiuddin, 30, and Amir Sohel, 23.

Of them, Masum and Mohiuddin are employees of the university.
