

Primary teachers follow time-schedule of own choice

MAGURA, Sept 11 (UNB):
Most government and nongovernment primary schools in 4
upazilas of the district have been
facing manifold problems for a
long time.

At present, there are 262 government and 92 registered non-government primary schools in Sadar, Sreepur, Salikha and Mohammadpur upazilas of the district.

But in most of the schools, students have to attend their classes in serious difficulties due to shortage of accommodation and furniture, besides inadequate water supply and absence of toilet system.

Moreover, the situation is aggravating with the increase in the number of admission-secking students and shortage of teachers, local leaders and guardians

complained.

They also alleged that a good number of teachers always remain absent and some attend the school at the time of their own choice after completing other duties.

Extremists arrested

Police arrested three leaders of so-called Sharbahara Party from Dighalgram village in Salikha upazila of the district.

Acting on a secret information a police force led by Delwar Hossain, ASP, raided the hideouts at the village and arrested Salim, Nazrul and Chitya.

A cut-rifle was also recovered from their possession.
