

## APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AT NON-GOVT EDN INSTTS

# Govt publishes first ever list of 12,619 selected people

NON-Government Teachers' Registration and Certification Authority on Sunday published a list of 12,619 selected candidates to appoint them as teachers at the non-government schools, colleges and madrassahs.

Education minister Nurul Islam Nahid said that this selection done by the NTRCA would ensure quality teachers recruitment at the non-government schools, colleges, madrassahs and technical institutions.

The selection process was transparent and corruption free, said Nahid while unveiling the results at a press conference at the education ministry.

Authorities of non-government educational institutions sent to the NTRCA requisition of how many teachers they would need and NTRCA selected the

people from among those who had passed the first to twelfth NTRCA exams to recommend them for recruitment as teachers on the merit basis, he said.

This year, 6,470 non-government educational institutions made requisition for appointing 14,669 teachers at their institutions. Some 2.50-lakh candidates had made 13.75 lakh applications for the job of the teachers as one applicant can apply for multiple schools, colleges and madrassahs for the job.

Nahid warned actions against authorities of educational institutions if they demand any kind of money from the selected people while they go for joining at the recommended educational institutions.

NTRCA had selected 12,619 people as they did not receive any applications for 718 teaching posts mostly for the positions of

teachers for physical education and different posts of ibtedayi madrassahs.

NTRCA did not select people for 1,095 positions of assistant teachers of computer subject as the appointment in this post is a sub-judice matter, said officials.

Before this selection process, governing bodies of non-government educational institutions were the sole authorities for recruitment of teachers at their educational institutions. Government in December 2015 took decision for teachers appointment for the non government educational institutes through a commission.

Government took the decision as there were widespread allegations of unfair means, including financial transaction and nepotism, in the recruitment process controlled by the institution's governing body, said Nurul Islam Nahid.
