

As Clinton struggles, Trump tries to raise doubts

REPUBLICAN presidential nominee Donald Trump is fighting to raise doubts about Democratic rival Hillary Clinton as she struggles to get past a new firestorm over her emails that have posed a sudden danger with eight days to go until Election Day.

The announcement by FBI Director James Comey that his agency is investigating more emails as part of a

some unruly Muslims who attacked temples, houses and business establishments and looted them on Sunday.

Some Muslims carried out the attacks on allegation of hurting religious sentiment of Muslims by a Hindu youth.

'We, children and women, took shelter at a house made of bricks while they attacked our house. They destroyed many things and I cannot find my books till 3:00pm,' said Anamika, a student of Nasirnagar Ashutosh Pilot High School.

Her aunt Dolan Sutradhar, a resident of Sutradharpara, said that they were worried about sending Anamika to the exam centre but they would do it by sending two people guarding her. 'It is a public exam and matter of her future as my niece had

good result in primary completion exam,' she added.

Anamika's neighbor Preeti Sutradhar, a Bachelor of Arts student, who is taking second year final exam, said that her preparation was badly affected due to the attacks that had compelled them to stay at home over security concern.

Nasirabad Degree College student Preeti's next exam for Philosophy fourth part would be held on Wednesday and Psychology fourth part on Thursday. 'I cannot go out and not finding my notes and books,' she said. 'Attackers took away all cell phones and I cannot contact friends for help.'

She said, 'I must sit for the exam.'

A last minute preparation of Primary Education Completion examinee Anik Sutradhar is badly hampered. He will sit for exam

from November 23 and all other fellow students of Class V at Nasirnagar Government Primary School are taking model tests.

At least 20 children, students of primary and secondary levels, are stayed at homes skipping classes on security grounds after the attack. All of them will either need to take public exam and final class tests in November.

Guardians said that they did not send their children to schools on Monday fearing harassment at schools.

'We cannot risk our children's life,' said Sheuli Rani Sarkar, mother of Class III student Shwarna Sarker at Nasirnagar government primary school.

'My daughter is asking me what we will do if the attackers attack us again,' she added.

Nasirnagar area is still

in tense and minorities fear more attacks although additional police, Border Guards Bangladesh and Rapid Action Battalion personnel have been deployed there.

About 150 houses and business establishments and over 15 temples of religious minority Hindus were vandalised and looted at Nasirnagar by groups of local Muslims demanding punishment for Hindu youth Rasaraj Das, 27, of Harinber village under Nasirnagar upazila for allegedly sharing a doctored photo setting an idol on the Kaaba on his Facebook wall on Friday.

Local people said that at least four or five groups of Muslim miscreants simultaneously attacked temples, houses and business establishments at Duttapara, Kalsipara, Namasudrapara, Mistripara, Namasudrapara, Mahakalpara and others.
