The Vice-Chancelior of Eugi neering University said the tech nical institutes in the country developed more like historical accidents rather than by deliberate planning. He said, that involvement of industries, agriculture of commerce sectors were minimal although , those were established to educate and train mannewer for employment in these very sectors The products of these institutions thus remained unfamiliar to the real-life needs and activities of those sectors, he added
