Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman on Thursday said that the colonial education system will be gradually replaced by a modern system suiting the needs of the nation, reports BSS.

Speaking as the chief guest at the first anniversary of founding of the 'Manarat Dacca' a children's school at Gulshan on Thursday morning the Prime Minister said that the bad things of the colonial system will be discarded while the good aspects will be retained.

Shah Aziz stressed on building of good citizens from tender age which he said was suitable for the purpose because it

was at that stage of life that perception and receptivity remain at their peak.

The Prime Minister said that the Islamic Education Centre will go into the matter to evolve an Islamic education system with stress on modern, scientific and technological education suiting the needs of the time.

He said that religious education will be made a must at the primary level so that the children of the followers of different religions could have true religious moral and ethical teachings at the schools. This he added was essential for building good and honest citizens.

The simple function in observance of founding anniversary of the school was presided over by Mr. Abdur Razzak Laskar Chairman of the governing body of 'Manarat Dacca' and addressed by Mr. Justice Al-Haj A.K.M Baquer Mr Charita Ranasinha High Commissioner of Sri Lanka in Bangladesh, Barrister Tamizul Huq and Mr Shahjahan.

The Prime Minister said that fear of God, the spirit of renunciation and contentment should form the basis of education policy with the objective of building good citizens.

Shah Aziz said that Islam alone can provide solution to the present day world torn by conflicts cold and hot wars.

Describing the Holy Quran as the fountain head of knowledge science and technology the Prime Minister said that the mosques were once the centres of research of knowledge, science and technology.

He said that the Muslim scholars in the ninth and the tenth centuries had made significant contributions in the va.
