## Vocational education will be made compulsory: PM

Pr me M'nister Shah Azizur Rahman said that vocational education will be made compulosory in primary secondary schools of the country, reports BSS.

He was inaugurating the newly constructed science building of Siddheswary Girls College at the College auditor, um in Dacca on Thursday.

The Prime Min'ster said that the government has laid emppasis on technical and vocational education to meet the requirement of the modern age of science and technology.

Mr. Noor Mohammed Khan a sen or member of the governing body of the college presided over the function which was also addressed by Mrs. Syeda Sham-e-Ara Hossain Principal of the college and Amena Khatun a student.

The Prime Min'ster said that the Ministry of Education was implementing step by step the decision to have government women's college one each at district and sub-divisional had, quarters.

He said that the government was very eager to spread education among the women who

constitute half of our total population.

He said that the government decision to appoint fifty per cent female teachers in primary schools was also being impremented gradually.

He urged the womenfolk to come forward to walk shoulder to shoulder with men in the national development activities.

Regarding government steps towards development of women the Prime Minister referred to the creation of Womens' Affairs Ministry and o her programmes aimed at involving the women in production activities and theirby increasing their family income.

Referring to the financial problems faced by the private educational institutions of the country, the Prime M nister urged the well to do people to extend their helping hand by way of donation.

Shah Aziz said that citizens are free to take part in any political activity of their chorce but teachers and studen's should not bring politics in the class-rooms.
