

Keep campus clean : T. H. Khan

Mr. T. H. Khan, Minister for Education Information and Culture on Wednesday stressed the need for imparting proper education and eliminating malpractices from the sacred arena with the aim to achieve welfare for the nation reports BSS.

The Minister was addressing a function in Dacca on Wednesday evening at the central office of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP).

Organised by the Bangladesh Jatiyotabadi Sramik Dal (BJSD) in observance of the 21st February, the function was also addressed by Health, Population Control and Manpower Minister Khondoker Abdul Hamid, and former Labour Minister, Reazuddin Ahmed, President of BJSD Mr. Iskander Ali presided over the function.

Justice Khan said the dreams of the martyrs of the Language Movement could be materialised and due honour to their bloods could be shown if the whole nation could be properly educated.

He urged the people to be attentive to proper education in the educational institutions to help maintain smooth academic atmosphere and stressed the qualitative developments in the sector.

The Minister said the heroic sons of the soil sacrifices their lives not only for establishing their mother tongue as a state language, but for the total well-being of the nation and added that it was only through proper education that objective could be achieved.

Khondoker Abdul Hamid said the late President Ziaur Rahman had consolidated the spirit of the Language Movement through introducing Bangladeshi nationalism which had made distinct our culture from that of the people across the national boundary.

He said the dreams of the martyrs could not be materialised through routine programmes of the 21st February, rather sincere attempts must be made to establish Bengali language at levels of administration and ordinary life.

Referring to the assassination of President Ziaur Rahman, Mr. Hamid said in his death the nation had suffered an irreparable loss and added that any further attempt to kill his ideals would not be tolerated by the people.

Mr. Hamid, terming the workers as the real patriots, said his government would not do anything detrimental to the interests of the labour community.

The BNP and Sramik Dal leaders urged the Government to take realistic measures to establish the Bengali language at all levels of Government administration and national life and urged the workers to renew their pledge to stand against all sorts of injustices in the society.
