

BCL demands removal of Ctg Govt College, Mohsin College principals

CHITTAGONG Metropolitan Chhatra League on Thursday demanded, at a press conference, that the principals of Chittagong Government College and Hazi Muhammad, Mohsin College be removed as they were allegedly showing indifference to the ongoing instability over the expulsion of Shibir activists.

The press conference was held in front of Hazi Muhammad Mohsin College administrative building at around 12:45pm.

Asked how they became sure that the college authorities were patronising Shibir, BCL leaders skipped the topic without addressing definite reason.

The authentic reason behind such indulgence of the authorities to Shibir could be ascertained, if their (principals') call lists were checked out, Chhatra League claimed.

However, Professor Jesmin Akter, Chittagong Government College principal, when asked on the allegation brought against her, said 'As a

government employee, I cannot patronise anyone.'

'All students are equal to me, none is friend or foe to me,' she added.

However, Anjan Kumar Nandi, Hazi Muhammad Mohsin College principal, could not be reached over phone for his comments till filing this report.

Chittagong Government College student, Kamrul Huda, also an activist of Metropolitan Chhatra League unit, read out the written statement at the press conference.

During the programme, BCL's metropolitan unit vice president Abu Md Arif, member Kaiser Uddin, Chittagong Government College unit member Raria Akbar and Mohsin College unit member Kazi Siam were present, among others.

Chittagong Chhatra League declared a four-point action plan at the press conference.

Earlier on December 31, 2015, the student wing put eight-point demand at a press conference held in Chittagong Press Club where they demanded the colleges be freed from Shibir.
