



Multi-purpose edn essential to develop creative faculty

Deputy Minister for Education Mr. Golam Sarwar on Thursday said that development of the creative faculty of children could be ensured through introducing a "multi-purpose education system".

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passed. Such a demand, he pointed out, tantamounted to asking the authorities concerned to issue certificates under a "virtual open general licence scheme without scrutiny and test."

He, however, said that the vast majority of students, teachers and guardians were opposed to such demand and tendency and added that government was determined to respect and protect their interest.

Mr. Mahbub warned that the examination centres where atmosphere had been vitiated through violence and lawlessness would be discontinued and if necessary the number of examination centres would be reduced.

The Minister pointed out that the government was going to bring about reforms by effecting changes in the education system to inspire the students to devote themselves to the studies and check unfair means in the examinations.

He said the government might examine the proposal to introduce semester system at the higher level of education at university and college levels.

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
