Private school students take exams with leaked questions: Mostafizur

Students of government primary schools did not get the leaked questions during the Primary Education Completion examinations as the students and their parents had no access to internet, claimed the primary and mass education minister Mostafizur Rahman on Sunday.

The students of private schools were probably involved with such 'unethical' practices as they and their parents had easy internet access, he added while inaugurating the two-day Innovation Fair and Showcasing organised by Directorate of Primary Education in Dhaka.

Criticising the educationists and others, who said that primary students were taking exams with the leaked question papers, Mostafizur said none of the government run primary schools students were involved with such activities.

The government had a plan to make asphalt pavement to every educational institutions which would ease the students' movement between their home and institutions during the rainy season, he said while giving his speech as the chief guest at the programme.

At the innovation fair a number of innovative ideas and projects of 30 government and other organisations were being displayed.

Primary and mass education ministry secretary Mohammed Asif Uz Zaman addressed and DPE director general Abu Hena Mostofa Kamal also spoke.
