

No MCQ at RU admission test

The authorities of Rajshahi University have decided to abolish multiple choice questions in the university's first year honours admission test from this year.

The decision came at a meeting of the sub-committee of the admission test on Wednesday with vice-chancellor Professor M Abdus Sobhan in the chair, confirmed RU pro-vice chancellor Professor Ananda Kumar Saha.

Ananda Kumar Saha told New Age that there would be no MCQ from this year.

'There will be a written examination of 100 marks. The duration of the examination will be two hours,' he said.

'We have also scrapped the unit into four from eleven units. Besides, we are going to give chance only 16,000 applicants to sit for the test under each unit only according to their CGPA results', the pro-VC added.

However, the decision would be finalised after holding the meeting of admission test main committee, he added.

The admission test date has been fixed primarily to be held on October 22 and 29.

Ananda Kumar said that the question would be made according to the syllabus what students were taught.

At present, almost all the higher educational institutions of the country hold MCQ-based exams for admission seekers.
