'There is no alternative to ensuring quality medical education . . . Supervision by the authorities concerned is a must to make sure that students can attain efficiency in medical science,' the president said when a delegation of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University made a courtesy call on him at Bangabhaban in Dhaka in the afternoon.
