

IU to introduce written exam in its admission test

The authorities of Islamic University in Kushtia have decided to introduce written exam in its first year honours courses admission test under 2018-19 academic session of the university.

IU vice-chancellor Professor M Harun-Ur-Rashid Askari approved the proposal of the university's central admisson test commitee, IU acting registrar SM Abdul Latif said on Friday.

According to the decision of IU central admisson test commitee, the intake test will be held, from November 4 to 7, in 120 marks. Among them, 20 marks are from written exam while 60 marks from MCQ and 40 marks from are from SSC and HSC examinations.

IU vice-chancellor Professor M Harun-Ur-Rashid told New Age they took the decision for admitting talented students.
