

MBBS admission test held, result within 3 days

The admission test for MBBS for 2018-19 session was held on Friday with reports of arrests for attempting to leak questions.

Some 65,000 students sat for the admission test for 10,300 seats, including 3,818 seats at government medical colleges, at 19 centres across the country.

Health minister Mohammad Nasim after visiting examination centers at Dhaka University told reporters that the examinations were held transparently.

'Enthusiastic meritorious students attended the tests and only the competent students will pass the examination,' he said.

Abdur Rashid, director for medical education at Directorate General of Health Services, told New Age that they had no report of anomalies in the examination.

'The examinations were held properly,' he said.

Rashid said they were working to publish the result within three days.

Meanwhile, the detectives of Dhaka Metropolitan Police on Thursday night arrested 10 people including three students and four guardians while they were buying 'fake question papers' of MBBS test at Mohakhali in the capital.

Three sellers – Dhaka University student Ashiqur Rahman, Daffodil International University student Ehsanul Haque and Tax officer Abul Hasan Shanta – were also arrested red handed, said Moshiur Rahman, deputy commissioner for detective branch at DMP.

He said few fake question papers, mobile phones and Tk 12,000 were also seized from them.
