Eighth convocation of DIU held

The eighth convocation of Daffodil International University (DIU) was held yesterday on its permanent campus in Ashulia of Savar.

Dr Md Sabur Khan encouraged the new graduates to become entrepreneurs and reminded them of the workshops, training, seminars, and lectures on entrepreneurship they had attended during the university life.

Dr Pornchai Mongkhonvanit said, "DIU has successfully prepared you to be here today. And it's you who will direct the nation, rule the job market and also create job placement for many others by being entrepreneurs."

"When I look at you, I see IT specialists, corporate leaders, pharmacists, journalists, various professionals and teachers -- all future leaders leading their countrymen to serve the whole world. The five faculties with 23 promising departments prove my vision," he added.

"Various statistics suggest the alarming rate of the unemployed graduates in Bangladesh and around the world. That means the more you are educated, the higher is the chance for you of remaining unemployed.
