## Make education realistic, work-oriented: CMLA

Chief Martial Law Administrater Lt. Gen. H. M. Ershad on Weenesday inaugurated the Computerised system of educational administration and management underlining the need for correct information and s'atistics to formulate p'ans and proper administration in education sector, reports BSS.

The CMLA said with the ex. pansion of educational facilities the Government wants to bring about a qualitative improvement in the system. We are earnestly eager for making education work-oriented and realis'ic' he said adding the Govern ment is already engaged in materialising various reformative measures in this regard.

Gen Ershad expressed hope that the use of computer will save time and resources in the proper implementation of plane and its evaluation for building up a healthy and suc. cersful educational system in the country.

The CMLA said there are one crore twenty-five lakh chil. dren of schoolgoing age in the play in sending their wards to

country of whom nearly thirty. nine lakh do not go to school at all. He said 80 per cent of the total children who go to school discontinue their studies before completion of the primary level

Gen Ershad described this situation as alarming and said we need to undertake realistic and effective steps immediately to halt this trend. The government is aware of this situation and have already taken various programmes to improve the s'tuation he added

He said the primary-level education, administration has already been taken to the Upa.-Z'a level under the decentralisation programme of the govern ment. He pointed out that only government's effort is not ado. qua'e to make the primary education universal and enphasis. ed the need for active participation and cooperation of the people in accomplishing this objective.

Gen. Ershad said the guard. ans have an important role to

school and ensuring that they (chaldren) complete their primary level education He said in order to get the fruits of the expanded facilities in education sector there is a need for dreat-. ing an a mosphere of coopera. tion and close confacts among the educational institutions leducation administration and the local people.

He expressed his satisfaction to learn that beside compiling all information and s'at's'ids in education sector the new com. ruler system at the Bereau of Efucational Information and Stat sice will work out menth.

The Elucation Minister ruled out the 'popular allegation' that use of computer would replace men by machine and added that introduction of the machin ne would not only he'p us street amilime the administrative me. thodology but also open up newer opportunities for employ. ment of Educated and qualified people.
