## 83 govt pry schools for Gopalganj, greater Dinajpur

GOPALGANI, Mar 12: The Facilities Department of the Ministry of Education has undertaken a programme to construct 16 government primary schools in five upazilas of Gopalgonj district during the current financial year. A sum of Tk 53.21 lakh has been sanctioned for this purpose.

Of the total, three primary schools will be constructed in Gopalganj Sadar, three in Kotwalipara, four in Kassiani, four in Tungipara and two in Muksedpur upazilas.

The construction work will be started soon and completed by June next.

## DINAJPUR

BSS adds: The Ministry of Education has taken up a scheme for constructing 67 Government primary schools in 23 upazilas of greater Dinajpur district at a cost of 2.38 crore.

The European Economic Commission (EEC) will provide financial assistant to the scheme during the currnt financial year.

Of the total primary school buildings, 40 will he constructed in Dinajpur at a cost of Tk

1.45 crore, 20 in Thakurgaon at a cost of Tk 69 lakh and seven in Panchagarh at a cost of Tk 24.21 lakh.
