**90 pc students support CSAC, Sultan claims**

Sultan Mohammad Mansur, Central Students Action Committee (CSAC) nominee for the post of Vice-President of the DUCSU, has claimed that victory of his panel in the January 8 elections is certain. 90 per cent of the students of Dhaka University support it.

He said that his panel would have a sweeping victory as there was no provocation from the government side.

When asked whether there would be any rift in the CSAC, as apprehended by many, Mr Sultan said that no one would be able to crack the unity of CSAC just by confusing the students.

He said that the CSAC had already announced its 10-point manifesto which included implementation of the rules and regulations formulated by the education environment committee. The CSAC was upholding the spirit of the liberation war and would work for ensuring the autonomous status of the university, he said.

When asked whether Eight Party Alliance leader Sheikh Hasina would visit the campus to give a moral boost to the supporters of CSAC, Mr Sultan said that the CSAC was not subservient to any political party or combine, rather, it represented the pro-independence political current.

Mushtaque Hussain CSAC candidate for the post of General Secretary, said that there was no possibility of their defeat in the election if there was no conspiracy from behind by the government.

He recalled that the CSAC was formed to build up resistance against autocracy when this government came to power.

In reply to a question, he said that although the government had banned the Natun Bangla Chhatra Samaj that supported it, it was now trying to utilise many other students organisations to have a footing in the campus. CSAC panel: vice-president Sultan, Mohammad Mansur Ahmed, general secretary.
