## Stamford University holds seminar on extremism

Stamford University Bangladesh organised a students' dialogue against violent extremism on the university's Shiddheshwari campus in Dhaka on Saturday.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police's Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime unit chief Monirul Islam attended the event as chief guest while United Nations Development Programme project manager Robert Stoleman was present as special guest. Emeritus professor M Feroze Ahmed presided over the event, said a release.

Monirul said the young generation must be aware of violent extremism. He mentioned a facebook page named 'Hello CT' run by his unit where students could share stories and pictures about violent extremism or mugging. 'You can also contact, if you fall prey to cyber bullying,' he told the students.
