

BUET students vow to resist terrorism, communalism

The protesting students of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology on Wednesday took oath to resist terrorism and communalism form the campus.

Around 350 students of various departments took part the oath-taking ceremony at BUET auditorium at around 1:30pm. Rafia Rezawana, a student of 17th batch, read out the oath.

Vice-chancellor Professor Saiful Islam, along with faculty deans and hall provosts attended the programme.

Abrar, a second-year electrical and electronic engineering student, was beaten to death, reportedly by Chhatra League activists at the university's Sher-e-Bangla Hall on October 7.

His murder triggered protests at the top engineering university and brought academic activities to a grinding halt. VC Islam later acceded to the protesters' demands and banned organisational politics, among others, on the campus.
