Information Minister Syed Naimuddin Hashim on Satur. day cautioned that all development programmes national efforts and dreams to save 68,000 villages would be futile if we fail to ensure speedy expansion of education in the country reports BSS.

He was speaking at the 20th guardians day and annual prize distribution ceremony of the Residential Model School and College in Dhaka on Saturday morning

The Information Minister who witnessed a march-past and a P.T. display by the students regretted that despite too much of propaganda in the last 30 years the history of eradication of illiteracy was discouraging in the absence of dedication de. finite goal and sincere efforts. He said during the last three decades the literacy rate had only incrased from 20 per cent to 22 per dent. As a result the number of filliterates which was three crore out of popula. tion of four and a half crore had now years ago rose to seven crore out of nine crore population he added.

The function rounded off with a cultural programme was also addressed by Principal of the College Mr. Lutful Hai. der Chowdhury.

Syed Najmuddin pointed out that the student community was not isolated from the existing socio-economic condition of the country. Similarly arrangement for their education and training was not also irrelevant he added.

The Minister said that the number of admission of stu. dents in primary schools in 1981 was 12 per cent less compared to the number in 1978. He poin ted out that of the total amount of money spent by government resource cons: despite dn primary educa. traints only 20 per cent tion was actually utilised for the pur pose,

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Minister said that no educational institution could survive for long in such an aimless system. He stressed the need for a total solution of the problem and made a fervent call to the students teachers guadians so said workers and politicians to make an united effort with the government in overcoming the situation.

Mr. Hashim said that "one of the 18-point programmes an. nounced by the Chief Marital! Law Administrator was on the improvement of education sys. tem and ensuring future securi ty of the students. As a result he pointed out that the Govern ment had undertaken a crash programme to raise the rate of literacy from 22 to 50 per cent by 1987. He disclosed that Taka 59 crore would be spent this year to rehabilitate the edu cation with the objective of lay ing strong foundation for our future education system.

Haider Chowdhury in his wel. come address gave a detail account of the activities and performances of Residential Model School and College duing the past one year. He said that the number of students of the institution set up in 1960 had increased from 380 at inception of 1.020 at present.

The Vice-Principal of the Col. lege Shah Mohammad Zakirul Huq and Mr. Minir Ahmed Kadri a student also spoke on the occasion.
