

IU students staying illegally asked to vacate halls

The authorities of Islamic University in Kushtia on Wednesday asked the students, who were 'illegally' staying in the residential halls, to vacate the halls by August 1.

A press release, signed by the hall provosts of the university, was issued in this regard on Wednesday.

The outsiders and the students, who have completed their graduation, were asked to leave the hall by August 1.

The university administration would take legal action against the students if anyone tried to forcibly stay and refused to leave the dormitory, the statement read.

The respective hall authorities also issued a notification asking their illegally staying students to leave the halls within the time limit.

The university authorities took the decision as the drug-taking incidents were increasing on the campus alarmingly.

IU is the secured zone for drug traders. Many of the drug traders were activists of the university unit of the Bangladesh Chhatra League, a student wing of the ruling Awami League, sources said.

Professor Shaikh Abdus Salam, vice-chancellor of IU, said that they suspended two students from the university for their alleged involvement with drugs. They would raid the halls soon, he added.

The authorities of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Hall on Wednesday prohibited its residential students from entering the hall after 11:00pm.
