The Association of School-Based-Education conducted research as to why the majority of the schools age-children, are not attending their schools and also why the large number of enrolled students drop out before the completion of primary education.

The research has revealed that the existing system of imparting education in primary schools is the root cause of illiteracy and drop-out.

In the present system of imparting education in primary schools, teachers give lessons to students and the students have to prepare their lessons at home with the help of house tutors or parents or other

in the class. If giving and taking lessons are completed in the class, it will be much easier for students as well as for parents to let their children continue education. If this kind of school-based education is introduced in primary schools, parents will be relieved from the responsibilities of managing house-tutors for their children and the children will be able to help their parents in domestic affairs. But it can also be mentioned that, for school-based-education, time should be extended from 30/35 minutes to 60 minutes for each class and teachers should be given proper training and ample facilities.
