NSU celebrates its top ranking in Bangladesh

The students, teachers and officials of North South University celebrated on Thursday as the university was ranked as the top university in Bangladesh in the global rankings by the Times Higher Education.

In the latest World University Rankings 2023, published by the Times Higher Education, the university was ranked between 601 and 800 among all universities worldwide, becoming the top Bangladeshi university.

NSU celebrated the achievement by holding a rally, releasing balloons, discussion sessions, and cultural events on its campus in Dhaka.

On the occasion, vice-chancellor professor Atiqul Islam said, 'We could rank even higher in the global ranking if we could have PhD students in our university.'

He urged the government to allow the university to enrol PhD students.

Pro-vice-chancellor M Ismail Hossain said, 'It's a great achievement for NSU and for our country as a whole because this is the first time in the history of our country that five universities have been ranked by this prestigious ranking.'

NSU registrar Ahmed Tazmeen, School of Business and Economics dean Helal Ahammad, School of Humanities and Social Sciences dean Abdur Rob Khan, School of Engineering and Physical Sciences dean Javed Bari and School of Health and Life Sciences dean Hasan Mahmud Reza also attended the events.
