Training on Japanese culture begins at NSU

The second batch of the Bangladesh-Miyazaki ICT Engineers Educational Training programme kicked off with an orientation event at the B-JET centre on May 3.

The programme — a joint initiative between North South University, the University of Miyazaki, the Japan International Cooperation Agency and the Bangladesh Computer Council — aims to prepare Bangladeshi university students across all disciplines for successful careers in Bangladesh and Japan.

Mohammad Khasru Miah, director of the Career and Placement Centre and initiator of the B-JET centre, welcomed the participants.

The second batch's course comprises 24 hours of training, with two-hour classes held weekly at the NSU premises.

Expert Japanese language instructors and business professionals from Japan will lead the training, covering topics such as Japanese culture, study methods, business etiquette and fundamental computer engineering concepts.

Trainees will also receive interview preparation and resume writing guidance to enhance their chances of securing employment in Japan.

Shinnosuke Tasaka, project manager of the B-JET centre, attended the orientation, providing valuable information on the regulations, policies, and opportunities available to trainees upon completing the programme.

The University of Miyazaki will issue a certificate of completion to those who meet the course requirements.
