

Note books for primary students to be banned

Government has decided to ban publication of note books for primary students upto class V. Education Minister Kazi Zafar Ahmed said in Dacca on Thursday, reports BSS.

He was speaking at a reception accorded in his honour at the Dacca District Sports Association (DDSA) auditorium, on Thursday afternoon. The reception was organised by Matlab Thana Students, Workers and Intellectuals Association in Dacca.

The Education Minister said the necessary steps to ban the publication of the notebooks will be taken up shortly. He sought cooperation from all concerned to implement this programme.

Later, a special prayer was offered for salvation of the departed soul of Mr. Zainul Abedin Choudhury, a former General Secretary of Bangladesh Teachers' Association, who was an inhabitant of Matlab Thana of Comilla district.

A cultural function was also held to mark the occasion.
