Jahangirnagar University admission test begins tomorrow



The admission test for the first-year undergraduate (honours) program of the 2024-25 academic year at Jahangirnagar University will commence tomorrow.

The first exam will be for the 'D' (Faculty of Biological Sciences) unit, where female candidates will take part in five shifts. The test will be held in five shifts, starting at 9:00am and concluding with the fifth shift at 3:15pm.

The following day, February 10, will see male candidates take the same exam, also in four shifts. Besides, the 5th shift will host the IBA-JU admission test, open to both male and female applicants.

The total number of seats available for the 'D' unit is 310, while IBA-JU has 50 seats.

The admission test for the 'E' unit (Faculty of Business Studies) and the 'A' unit (Faculty of Mathematical and Physical Sciences and the Institute of Information Technology) will be held on Tuesday, February 11. The remaining shifts of the 'A' unit will be conducted on Wednesday, February 12. The 'E' unit has 200 seats, while the 'A' unit has 426 seats.

On Thursday, February 13, the admission test for the 'C' unit (Faculty of Arts and Humanities, Faculty of Law, and the Institute of Comparative Literature and Culture) will be held. This unit has a total of 440 seats.

The 'C-1' unit (Department of Drama and Dramatics, and Department of Fine Arts under the Faculty of Arts and Humanities) and the 'B' unit (Faculty of Social Sciences) admission tests will take place on Monday, February 17. The 'C-1' unit has 64 seats, while the 'B' unit has 326 seats.

For the 2024-25 academic year, a total of 1,816 seats are available, with an equal distribution of 908 seats for male and female students. Detailed information and results regarding the admission test can be found on Jahangirnagar University's admission website: ju-admission.org.

Regarding security measures for the admission test, the university's Proctor, AKM Rashidul Alam, said, "A total of 150 police personnel, 60 Ansar members, 60 BNCC members, and 60 Rover Scouts will be deployed on campus. Additionally, traffic police have been instructed to be stationed on the Dhaka-Aricha highway to ensure smooth movement during the admission test."
