

Action against 19

BUET students, 9 expelled

By Our BUET Correspondent Discipline of Eangladesh University for Engineering and Technology took legal actions against 19 students of the uni versity on Wednesday for v.o. lating university discipline.

The action taken under OrdL/ nance 5(A) of BUET ranged from warning to expulsion and restriction on entry into residential halls.

Of the 19 students, nine students were expelled four for two years and five for one year three students were warned and seven students were expel. led but the expulsion order was kept in abeyance for further observation.

The students who have been expelled included Mahindain Ahmed Jhantu, President and Farug Amjad Khan, General Secretary of BUET unit of pro-Awami League Bangladesh Chhatra Lesgue.

The students who have been warned are: Masudur Rahman! Khan, fifth year (Architecture) ANM Habibullah Habib, fifth year (Architecture) and S M Waltur Rahman, fourth year (Mechanical): Habib is the president of BUET unit of Jatiyatabadi Chnatra Dal.

The seven students whose ex pulsion order has been kept in abeyance are: Rafel Kabir, second year (Mechanical), Md., Mohsin, third year (Mechanical), A. K. M. Badrul Islam, third year (Civil), Farid Ahmed fourth year (Architecture), Abdul Aziz fourth year (Chemical), Quamruzzaman Khan, fourth year (Mechanical) and Nazrul Islam, third year (Civil).

It may be recalled that one! student belonging to Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal was injured in bomb blast in a series of clashes between the supporters of Bangladesh Chhatra League and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal on the campus last month. Following the clashes, one day's strike was observed in the university at the call of JCD.

When contacted the university authorities declined to divulge specific charges against the students accused of violation of disciplione.

The decision of the board will be placed before the Academic Council, which is the Appellate authority for approval.

Dr. A. S. A. Karoni, General Secretary of Engineering University Teachers Association said that offenders should be punished. He, however, said that the association would plead for the students if they appologise and repent for their offence.
