Madrasa superintendent jailed for 7 days for trying to leak questions



A madrasa superintendent in Pakundia was sentenced to seven days of jail and fined Tk 200 today for attempting to leak exam questions during the ongoing Dakhil English First Paper examination.

Md Abdul Halim, superintendent of Chakdiga Islamia Dakhil Madrasah, was apprehended at Mongalbaria Kamil Madrasah exam centre after being caught while trying to take a photo of the question paper and send it outside. Although he was not assigned duties at the centre, he entered the premises during the exam.

Assistant Commissioner (Land) of Pakundia Md Mamun Sarkar told The Daily Star he went to the scene after being notified.

He conducted a mobile court and sentenced Abdul Halim to seven days of imprisonment alongside a fine.

Teachers on duty at the exam centre caught Halim and informed the authorities immediately, he said.

"Measures were taken following due process," Mamun added.
