



## Call to reopen BUET soon

Mushtaque Hossain and Nazmul Huq, Prodnan President and General Secretary respectively of Bangladesh Chhatra League in a joint statement on Friday appealed to the authorities concerned to immediately reopen the Engineering University.

They also urged the authorities to soften their attitude in resolving the present problems. Otherwise they said, the closure of the university would serve the purpose of the quarters interested in disrupting the educational environment, they added.
