



Situation tense

The situation in the cam- of all the student organisations pus of Bangladesh. University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) remained tense yesterday with the students protesting closure of the university sine die and the order to vacate the halls.

About 50 per cent of the resident students left the halls by 10 last night, as ordered and the rest stayed on. Dining halls and canteens of the halls; were closed.

A procession of the students yesterday morning moved in and around the campus and gathered in front of the vice-chancellor's residence.

A section of the processionists turned unruly and caused : minor damages.

The students brought out another procession at night. Meanwhile, the Students Action Committee, a platform of BUET, protested the closure of BUET for an indefinite period

The committee said that the students would not leave the halls until their two-point demand was not fulfilled. The demands include abolition of class test system and increase of the amount of stipends.

The action committee demanded immediate reopening of the university.

Meanwhile, eight student organisations of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) in a joint statement yesterday alleged that the University authorities were creating confusion regarding 'class test' and 'examination.'
