BUET students keep off classes

The students of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) kept off their classes yesterday in protest against expulsion of three students of BUET for their alleged involvement in destructive activities on the campus on December 23 and 24 last.

The Board of Residence and Disciplinary Committee headed by the Vice-Chancellor of BUET earlier served show cause notice on 34 students.

Of them, 33 appeared before the board to defend themselves. Later one of them was expelled for two years and two for one year. Another six were given suspended expulsion order for one year which would automatically start coming into effect if they were found involved in illegal activities in future.

Twenty four others were warned.

Meanwhile, Engineering University Teachers Association (EUTA) had earlier announced that the teachers would go for

a strike for an indefinite period from January 17 if the authorities failed to give exemplary punishment to those who were responsible for the December 23-24 incidents.

It may be mentioned that on the night of December 23 some unruly students had put up barricades in front of the teachers quarters and later damaged some property on the campus.
