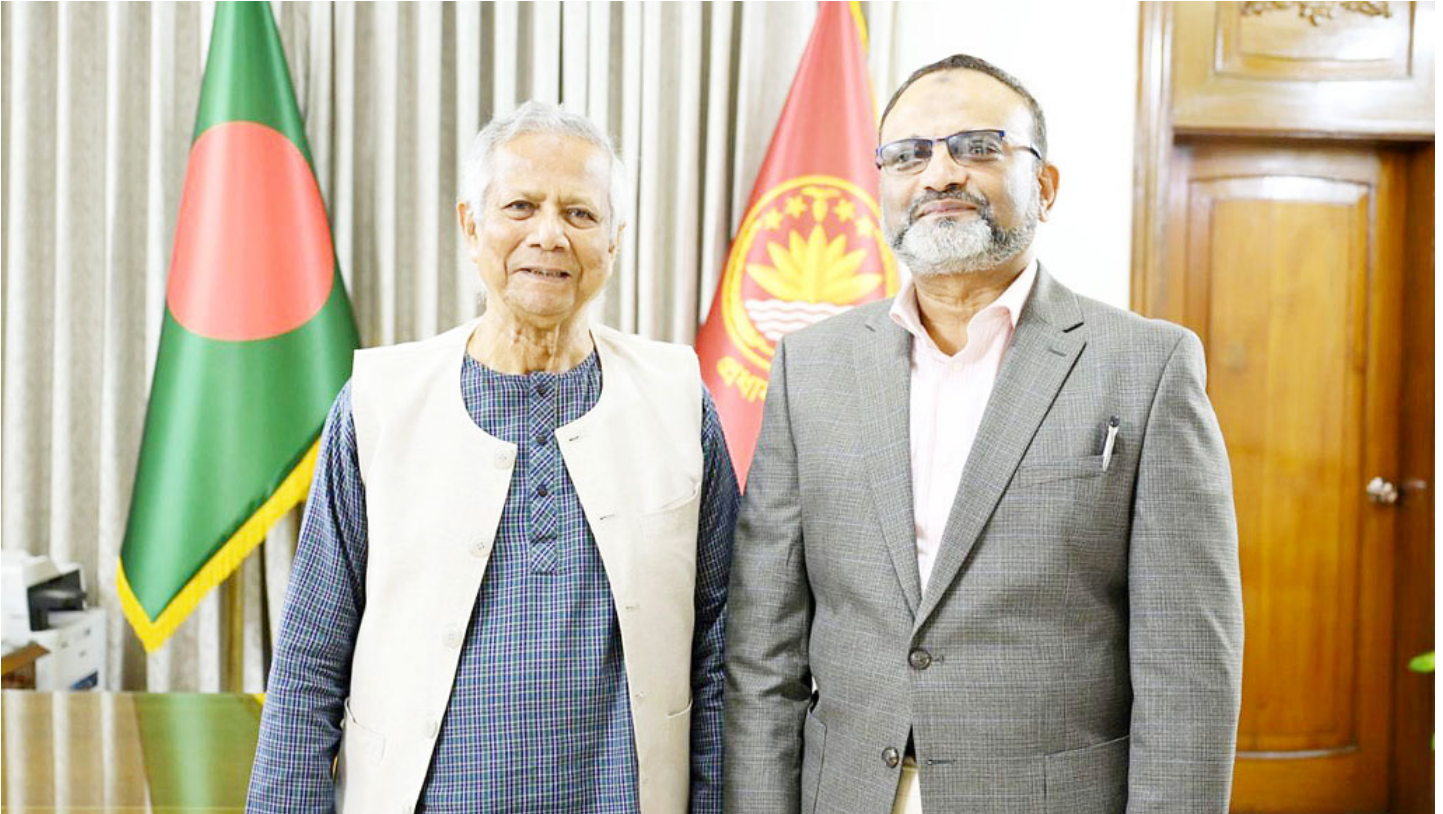


DU VC meets chief adviser
