Non-govt teachers call off strike

Non-government secondary school teachers on Sunday called off their 58-day strike and decided to join their duties by April 23.

The strike was called off after a settlement was reached tetween the Tetchers' Coordination Council and the govern. . ment on the day.

The gettlement followed the sit in and the mass hunger strike by the teachers infront of the Secretariat from Saturday morning:

About 25 lakh non-government secondary teachers wentfor a strike since February 22 demanding nationalisation of secondary education and implementation of revised pay-scale from June 88.
