The society will soon meet with a catostrophe if no effective measure is taken to stop this menace. A printed certificate provided the Board University testify ing the academic standard of an examinee is unwanted in the realm of knowledge or job market.

A committee was formed by the Govt under the leader. ship of Prof M. Shamsul

Huq to submit report on the reorganisation of the present day examination system. It submitted its findings long ago. Like other reports, per. haps, it has been thrown bito waste paper basket. In this age old colonial system of examination must be aban. doned and objective system must be introduced in SSC, and H.S.C. level. Infact objec tive test is followed in all the developed and developing countries of the world. Even after 15 years of independance we could not make any progress in this field.

I suggest that the examina tion centres of every upazile should be kept under frequent vigilance by a group of persons consisting of Board University representatives, Govt and private school|college Head Masters Principals, the officer-in-charge of examination centre concerned and the UNO. This may yelld. a salutory result. But thepresent system of examination must be replaced by a modern method followed in other countries.

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
