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More women colleges needed

Since last few years admission neoblem of all grades of students has been very acute and the guardi. ans of all boys and girls needing admission at any stage of education from baby class to the highest class in university are to pars almost sleepiess hights untile his or her ward or wards can be admitted in any institution (not necessarily the institution of his or her choice). If at all successful in getting admission most of the guardians almost in evitably fail to get their wards admitted in the desired institutions.

On the other hand many of institutions have no doubt a very big number of students in their roll but they have neither adequate number of efficient teachers in their teaching staff nor a good teaching environment or applicances. Most of ruch institutions, seem to assume the characteristics of educational business.

Obviously the standard of education in such institutions is not at all into expectation and it is obviously being deteriorated day by day. As the students move from lower level of education to

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higher level, the deterioration of educational standard are felt more gravely.

Generally the educational institutions, more particularly the higher insti_{tu}. tions are inadequate in our country. But their inade. quacy is very much telt in hig towns specially in Dhaka where so many people in ever growing number continuously rushing . from the rural areas. Due to increase in population the number of student is also growing at a faster rate than the increase in the number of institutions. Pra ctically the number of educational institutions remains almost static for long or it increases very slowly if at all.

Under the circumstances the problem of giving education to their wards has become a great cause of ten sion among the guardians. The guardians of the girl students who are required to be sent to college are specially affected by this problem. The grown up boys (i.e) those who are reading at college standard) can be sent to any college the environment of which may

or not be very desirable. This is because of the fact that a grown up boy is expected to be able to tackle even a difficult situation which a girl student can hardly be expected to do, of course, in our society Naturally all the guardins of the grown up girl students by to send their wards generally in a good girls' college having a better or safer atmosphere.

According to the present criteria, good women's colleges even in Dhaka city are very very limited. And due to extreme inadequacy of wemen colleges in this city the girl students as well as their guardians have been placed in an agonising situation. We, therefore feel that some more good standard women colleges better environment should be established in Dhaka. All existing and newly established women colleges should also be provided with more residential facilities. hope the authorites COTIcerned would look into the matter sympathetically

As such I draw the attention of the Vice Chancellor and the govt, in this regard with the request to reddress the grievences of the students seeking admission in BUET.
