## 10 pc interim relief for non-govt teachers in July

The teachers of non-governmental educational institutions will get 10 per cent interim relief from first July, reports BSS.

The decision was taken in a meeting of the Deputy Prime Minister and Political Adviser to the President Kazi Zafar Ahmed, Education Minister Sheikh Shahidul Islam and leaders of the Federation of Bangladesh Teachers Associations held at the office of the

Deputy Prime Minister at Sangsad Bhaban, on Tuesday, an official handout said.

The meeting also decided that from first July next, the Government allocation given on account of teacher's salaries to the non-government educational institutions will be given on monthly basis from July 1 next.

The meeting also reached consensus on a number of

issues. These are: introduction of national teachers welfare fund, inclusion of class three and four employees of non-governmental educational institutions in the national pay scale will begin from July 1.

All vacant posts in Government schools and colleges would be filled up through departmental promotion and lawful measures would be taken quickly in this regard.

After consultation with the Ministries of Finance and Establishment a Government order would be issued regarding giving time scale to the teachers and employees of nationalised schools and colleges upto May 31, 1985 on the basis of their effective service.

According to the recommendations of the Enam Committee permanent posts would be created in the nationalised schools and colleges and measures would be taken to regularise the services of the teachers.

Necessary Government order would be issued after discussions with the Ministries of Establishments and Finance regarding upgrading the pay scale of the headmasters of Government schools to 2800-4425.

Necessary Government order would also be issued for introduction of an unified pay scale by removing the anomaly in the pay scale of Kamel pass religious teachers in the Government schools, after consultation with the Ministries of Finance and Establishment.

Ali Reza, Prof. Kazi Faroque Ahmed, Prof. Moazzem Hussain Khan, Mr. M. Saidur Rahman, Prof. Ali Akbar Khan and Prof. Asadul Huq were present in the meeting.
