Prof Salam shares Nobel Physics Prize

STOCKHOLM, Oct 15: Two Americans and Pakistani won the 1979 Nobel Physics Prize today for work in a field which baffled Albert Einstein, the reach one common force which he suspected binds together the entire universe, reports Reuter.

The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences awarded the 800,000 kroner (191,000 dollar) prize to Professors Sheldon Glashow

and Steven Weinberg of the United States, and to Professor Abdus Salam, of Pakistan, who now lives in Britain and Italy.

The award was for the Scientists' contributions towards unifying the weak and electromagnetic forces in atoms.

Einstein struggled for 30 years to find a common basis for the four so far obvious forces of nature.

The 1979 Nobel Prize for Chemistry was today awarded to Professor Herbert Brown of Purdue University, Indiana and Professor Georg Wittig of University of Heidelberg, West Germany.
