Kazi Zafar Ahmed also said that the government had rejected the Education Commission Report of 1974.

Earlier, some members the NEAC wanted to know about the fate of the 'report' by Dr Qudrat-e-Khuda, said that questions had been raised by certain quarters about the report of the Qudrat. e-Khuda Commission and opined that the Government should clarify its position.

Kazi Zafar Ahmed said that the report was not rejected. Some steps had already been taken on the basis of that report. In this connection, mentioned the formation of National Education Curriculum Committee on the basis of the recommendation of the commission.
