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Disparity in universities

In the letter published in your column on July 31, 1983 in the Bangladesh Times, Mr. M. A. Khan pointed out a vital and a very important thing for the graduates of Dhaka University and about its education curriculum. It

has been divided into two parts: (a) Disparity between two universities, i.e. Rajshahi and Dhaka University. To obtain second division in Rajshahi University a student has to get 40 per cent of marks but in Dhaka University one is to get 45 per cent of marks. (b) In Dhaka University B.A. pass course, three subjects

have to be taken as combination papers on the other hand Rajshahi University requires only two subjects.

So from the above circumstances, we feel that such a prolonged disparity and unequal curriculum in university education or syllabus should not be continued. Because of this disparity many graduates of Dhaka University have failed to get good jobs Mr. Khan

has pin-pointed this problem and I would like to draw the attention of Vice Chancellor, of both the universities and also the Education Minister and urge upon them to take corrective measures.

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
