Malpractices in Degree exam

We the undersigned beg to invite your kind attention to a report published in a Dhaka Daily on 23rd October, 1983 about the malpractices in the Final Degree Examination which was occurred in a particular centre of the old Dhaka city area.

The report mentioned that some of the students who appeared at a particular centre were resorting to malpractices. It was found that there was no invigilators in the particular room where nearly one hundred students were sitting for the examination.

Now we want to say that

among the five thousand students only one hundred were found adopting malpractices. And for the crime of only one hundred students about five thousand candidates should not suffer under any circumstances.

It is unbelievable that all the five thousand students have resorted to malpractices where law and order situation was normal at the area during that time.

The university surveillance team when visited and found that the students were adopting unfair means in a particular room, they could easily take drasting action against these students only. It is not understood why the concerned team failed to do the same.

Under the above circumstan-

ces, we want to impress upon the concerned authority that all the examinees of the particular centre should not be victimised for the fault of some students. If any wrong is done the controlling authority of the said centre will be held responsible, not the general examinees and action may be taken only against those candidates who appeared at the particular room and we hope the authority will thus save the humble and meritorious students from a great threat.
