

Anti-fundamentalism 'Week' begins at BUET

The "Anti-Fundamentalism and Anti-Communalism Week", organised by Muktijudda Chhatra Command (MCC) and Bangladesh Chhatra Union (BCU) of BUET unit, began on the BUET campus yesterday.

The programmes of the week began with a procession and a rally.

After the rally, the students burnt an effigy of Golam Azam in front of the BUET cafeteria at around 12:30 pm.

The speakers at the rally regretted that there is no memorial to liberation war martyrs on BUET campus even after 27 years of independence.

They also demanded immediate setting up of a monument on the campus.

The rally was addressed by the MCC and BCU leaders.

A week-long photography exhibition also began on the campus yesterday on the occasion. It was dedicated to late journalist Munajatuddin and his son late Md Sadik Subarna, who was a student of BUET.

The other programmes include an essay competition on "Liberation War Consciousness: Thought of the Generation" and movie sessions.

On the first day, two movies — "They fought for their motherland" and "Battleship Potemkin" — were screened.
