EUCSU leaders, students seek reopening of BUET

Most of the students of

Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) and the leaders of Engineering University Central Students' Union (EUCSU) are in favour of reopening of the university immediately but the university authorities are yet to take any decision in this regard.

Talking to the Bangladesh Observer on Wednesday a number of students demanded reopening of BUET immediately as they do not want to be the victim of session jam. The university is now facing a regular session jam for one and half a year.

"We, the four thousand and five hundred students of the university can not bear the consequences of hooliganism which was unleashed by bearly 30 students," they said. They also said that they were very much frustrated because the university authorities have decided to close the university sine die when all preparations for their ensuing examinations, which were scheduled in the first week of May.

They opined that considering the sentiment of a large number of general students, the university authorities should reopen the university soon and should hold classes and examinations if necessary by deploying additional police personnel.

However, a source close to the university administration; informed that there was no possibility of reopening the university soon. "The university authorities will decide reopening of the university after submission of the probe body report," he said.

When contacted Vice-Chancellor of BUET Prof. M Nooruddin Ahmed refused to talk to this correspondent.
