

Comilla college nationalised in paper only?

With the initiative of Comilla Apex Club, a humanitarian organisation, the second private college of Comilla Town Comilla College (after Comilla Womens College now Govt.) was established in the first part of 1968 and No. 4 Bagichagaon Ward under Comilla Poursava.

As the prestigious Comilla Victoria College has been transformed into a Government College in the same year, the said club members with the active co-operation of the local philanthropists and leaders felt the need of setting up a private college to spread the light of higher education particularly among those students who could not quality in the upgraded said Govt. College.

The then, Deputy Commissioner and Additional Deputy Commissioner of Comilla Mr.

Abdus Samad and Mr. Nurul Islam respectively along with the local elites co-operated generously to start the classes of intermediate section in the first phase in an 'acquired' building (Single storey) on July 1, 1968.

Later on three more corrugated-sheet sheds for Intermediate and Degree sections have been constructed in its (Compound) campus and at present it has been regarded as the second prominent largest college of Comilla.

After much hard labour and effort during the last 17 years the college has been upgraded into a govt. college with effect from July 1, 1985 by a Govt. Gazette notification.

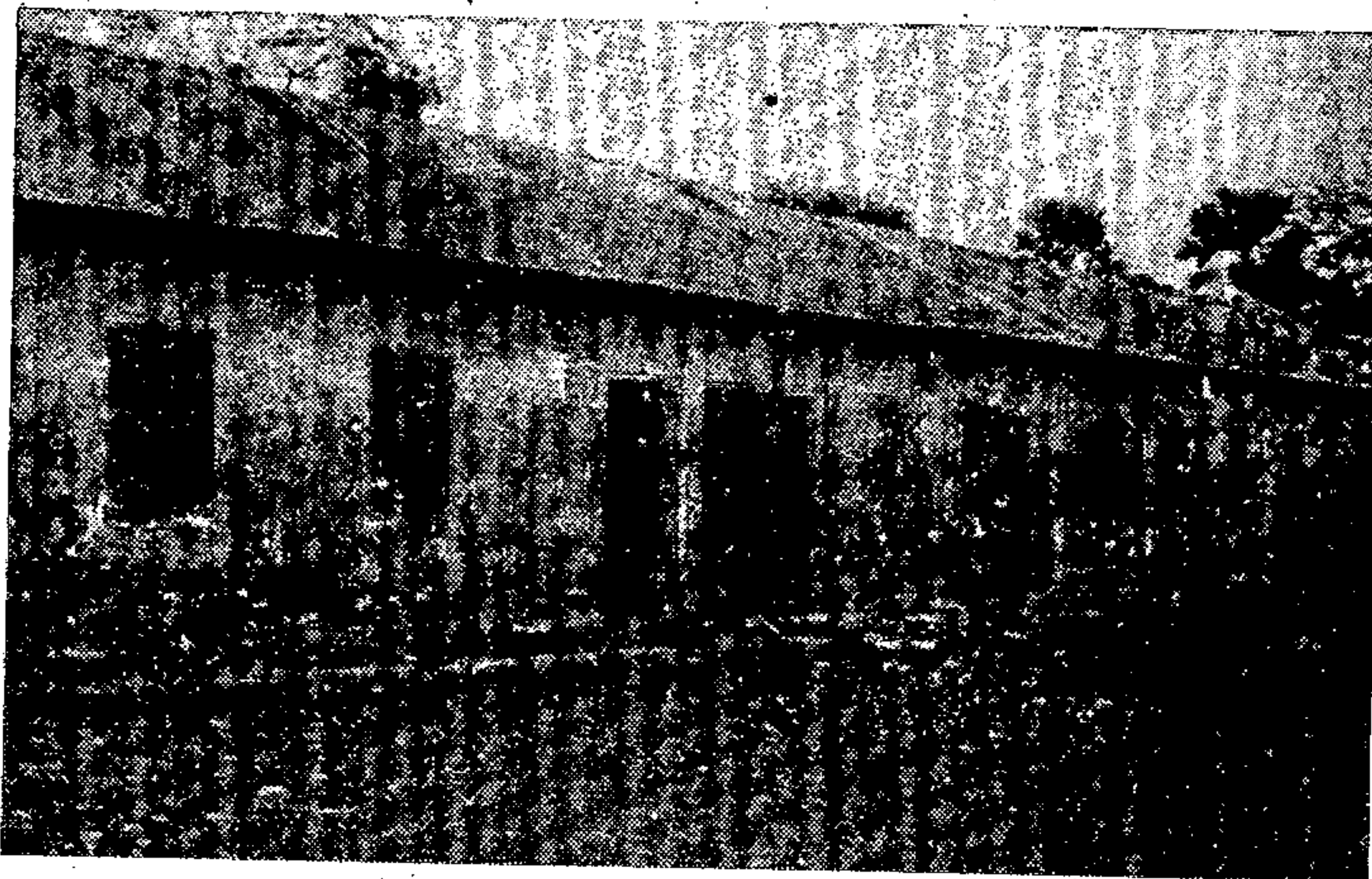
As a result of which 6 assistant professors, 13 lecturers

and all its officials and employees (fourth class) excluding the present principal, who have requisite qualifications and service tenure were to be entitled for Govt. status.

Over 2000 students got the privilege of being students of a Govt. College. While the college authority handed over a cash deposit of Taka 9 lakh the Govt. Fund.

Though upgraded into a Govt. college, its lacks in facilities leaving a Govt. college.

The Comilla-dwellers had urged upon the relevent Ministry not to upgrade the college in the paper only but in the real sense of the term.
