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Teachers training to be geared

Govt has taken plans for training teachers in the Third Five Year Plan with provision for continuous training of primary and secondary teachers at the PTI's and the TTC's.

At the primary level 70% of the teachers are trained while the same number of teachers at the HSC level need to be trained.

Formal once in a life time training at a PTI in order to qualify as a teacher is in no way adequate for the growing needs of the country.

Refresher courses are needed for the teachers from time to time

According to the plan, training of teachers is to be carried out through cluster trainings arranged as a crash programme under the UPES.

There are also provisions for inservice training for the secondary school teachers which shall be decentralised and carried out in nine science education development centres attached to the TTC's under the secondary school development project.

To achieve this target, a new PTI is to be set up at Rangamati and the other two PTI's are to be completed. A new PTI under the UPE National Scheme shall be set up at Joydebpur

Audio visual aids like charts, posters, graphs, maps etc will be supplied to the primary and secondary schools under the BIDE project to aid better training.

TV sets, video, tapes cassettes, taperecorders, film slides and film projectors and will be supplied to the TTC's, NIEAER and NAPE under the BIDE project.

Besides, BIDE shall run correspondence B.ED course for teachers to be implemented by trained hands.

Provisions is also there to conduct inservice training for successful teachers in madrasas which are being arranged in the SEDCS under the ADB assisted secondary school development project.
