## Govt colleges beset with problems

BARGUNA, Jan 16: Barguna Government College has been plagued with many problems recently in serious impasse in its academic pursuit.

The problems include shortage of accommodation furniture, teachers and educational appliances.

The existing class rooms are too few in number to meet the requirement of the student. As such, many scheduled classes are to be cancelled even after using practical and seminar rooms for hold up classes.

In the absence of an examination hall in the college, scheduled classes are suspended for months together during HSC, and Degree examinations.

The four tin-sheds used to class rooms have become worn-out.

More than 20 posts of teacher have long been lying vacant on account of which the HSC students in general, and degree students, in particular, are deprived of necessary classes. Due to shortage of teachers, the college could not obtain university affiliation.

Besides, out of six sanctioned posts of office assistant only one is working at present.

The principal's quarters has become dilapidated due to lack of repair. The tin-shed for meant the popose has been seriously affected by the recent cyclonic storm.

The 20-seat students hostel cannot meet even 25 per cent of the requirement.

A sum of Tk 46 lakh was reportedly sanctioned for the uplift of the college. But till

today, the college authority has not received the funds.

### LALMONIRHAT

Our Lalmonirhat Correspondent writes: The Government JUKAG college in Lalmonirhat district, which was once reputed for its academic excellence, has now been facing multifarious problems.

Out of 38 sanctioned posts of teachers, 13 have long been lying vacant. So much so, many scheduled classes are not taken everyday due to shortage of teachers.

For want of an examination hall, routine classes are suspended during HSC and degree examinations. In this way, about four months of academic session are wasted
