School students continue hunger strike

The fast unto death by the students and teachers of Ramna Railway High School continued for the second consecutive day yesterday.

Three of the hunger strikers were admitted to hospital as their condition deteriorated yesterday.

Fourteen teachers, 15 students and four staff of Ramna Railway High School with a student strength of 600 went on a hunger strike unto death in front of the Jatiya Press Club on Tuesday to press home their demand for a suitable alternative arrangement before removal of their school from the Osmany Udyan.

Besides, a good number of students including girl students started a token hunger strike on Tuesday.

Meanwhile, different political parties, and social organisations including Bangladesh Supreme Court Bar Association.
