

2 mosques to be built in UK

Muslim communities in Bradford, Yorkshire and Northern England are to build two mosques at a cost of 35 lakh pound sterling in the Wool city which has some 28,000 to 30,000 Muslims, says a BIS Press release in Dacca on Thursday, reports BSS.

The larger of the projects is for a mosque and community centre costing pound 2,500,000 to pound 3,000,000 planned by Jamiyat Tabligh-ul-Islam. The smaller is for a mosque costing 500,000 proposed by Jamia Hanfia.

The mosques will join a total of 132 listed mosques in towns and cities throughout Britain. Many are quite modest buildings but the larger ones in cities such as London and Birmingham have not hesitated to utilise modern facilities, including car parks and automatic lifts.
