

Education should enrich moral values

Mr. Justice Ruhul Islam of Bangladesh Supreme Court on Saturday made a strong plea for introduction of an education system in the country that would help develop moral values among the people to build a strong nation.

Addressing the inaugural function of the second annual conference of Islam Chhatra Shibir, a student organisation, as the chief guest Justice Ruhul Islam said that such an education system should also help protect the independence and sovereignty of the country and ensure social security.

Presided over by Mr. Mohammad Qamruzzaman, President, Islam Chhatra Shibir, the inaugural function was also addressed by former Presidential Adviser Prof. Syed Ali Ahsan, Mr. Justice A. K. M. Baquer and Dr. Ashraf Siddiqui.

Justice Islam said that the education system introduced by the British regime was contrary to the religious belief, norms and basic necessities of the Muslims.

He suggested that the education policy should be framed in such a way that it helped to bring about basic changes in national life in the light of Islamic ideals.

Prof. Syed Ali Ahsan said that the education system of the country should reflect the ideals of Islam; the religion which was followed by 85 per cent of the population. The education should prove equal to the needs of life; he said.

Mr. Justice A. K. M. Baquer said that only Islam could bring peace to this tension-ridden world. Despite tremendous material development in many countries of the world, peace could not yet be ensured because these lacked moral and spiritual foundations.

Justice Baquer called upon the youths to build up their characters in the light of Islam to guide all men towards peace.

Dr. Ashraf Siddiqui urged the youths to work for removing the poverty of the people alongside building their characters.
